New Hampshire cities, towns, and counties can become **default electricity provider** for their residents + businesses and provide related services.







Customer Notification and Enrollment Process

- At least 30 days before program launch all electric customers will be mailed notifications including the initial fixed rate for Community Power service compared with their Utility's rate
- Customers on Utility default energy service are able to decline participation or "opt-out" by calling 1-866-603-POWR, or by emailing info@CommunityPowerNH.gov; or visiting www.CommunityPowerNH.gov
- If a customer is already getting their power from a competitive supplier, nothing will change unless they choose to "opt-in" to Community Power.
- The Utility will continue to deliver electricity using their poles and wires, provide billing services, and ensure reliability.
- Rates posted at least 30 days in advance; customers can switch supplier at next meter read upon request with no penalty or exit fee.
- Community Power is self-funded by rates paid by participating customers. No taxes will be used to cover program expenses.



Key Points

- If/when Community Power launches, most Utility default electric supply customers will be automatically enrolled in the same service for a lower price. Community Power will be the new default electricity supplier for a Town's customers.
- Participation in Community Power is voluntary. Customers can choose to opt-out and to stay with Eversource for electric supply, or shop for another market option.
- The Utilities will continue to deliver electricity using their poles and wires, provide billing services, and ensure reliability.
- Customers shopping with third-party suppliers will remain with their supplier unless they choose to opt-in to Community Power.
- Community Power will be self-funded by rates paid by participating customers.
 No taxes will be used to cover program expenses.

How County Community Power Works

County Community Power process is the same as the municipal process (Join, Plan, Launch, Operate)

1. County Joins CPCNH

Commissioners vote to adopt JPA + form Electric Aggregation Committee (EAC)

2. County Develops/Adopts Electric Aggregation Plan (EAP)

□ CPCNH equips EAC with EAP → conducts public hearings → County Delegation (legislative body) adopts EAP → PUC Approval → County Commissioners authorized to contract for services to launch program

■ 3. Launch

CPCNH launches program.

□ 4. Operate

- County CPA is an opt-in program for all electric customers in the county
- Municipalities within the county may elect County CPA as default service by majority vote of governing body.

Advantages of County Community Power

Streamlines process, speed of adoption, availability to customers

- County manages EAP development, hearings, PUC approval, and other regulatory compliance and operational requirements
- ✓ Benefits smaller towns with less administrative and volunteer capacity
- Ensures all electricity customers in the county have the opportunity to opt-in and gain access to energy choices and savings

Opt-in option for all customers

Process for Town to Join County Community Power

- Municipality may elect County CPA as <u>default electricity provider</u>
- ✓ Once County Community Power is live:
 - Town governing body (select board) votes to join program on opt-out basis
 - County CPA / CPCNH authorized to acquire data, commence launch
 - Enrollment letters mailed → customers enrolled 30 days after mailing

Select Board may enroll default customers on an optout basis

Electric Aggregation Plan

- Merrimack County Board of Commissioners established a Committee pursuant to RSA 53-E to oversee development of the Electric Aggregation Plan (EAP).
- EAP details how the Merrimack County Community Power program will operate and comply with state legal requirements.
- ~ There will be two Public Hearings on 2/13/2024 and 2/27/2024 to educate the Community about the Plan and to receive community input.

Purpose of the Electric Aggregation Plan

- Defines program goals and objectives
- Defines governance; implementation; customer noticing, enrollment, options
- Commits the County to comply with applicable statutes and regulations:
 - (a) Providing universal access, reliability, and equitable treatment of all classes of customers;
 - (b) Meeting, at a minimum, the basic environmental and service standards established by the Public Utilities
 Commission and other applicable agencies and laws and rules.

The Plan does:

Address issues required to be considered by RSA 53-E including:

- a) How net metering will be provided;
- b) How customers enrolled in the Electric Assistance Program will receive their discount.

The Plan does not:

- Otherwise commit the County to any defined course of action; or
- Impose any financial commitment or liability on the County or its taxpayers.

County Program Governance

County Community Power Council

- ✓ Purpose: establish a transparent, participatory, and flexible decision-making structure for mutual advantage of participating municipalities
- ✓ Each town electing County CPA as default electricity provider may appoint a representative to <u>Community Power Council</u> which duties include:
 - Ensure participating municipalities are informed about program happenings.
 - Support interested communities to join program
 - Nominate individuals for County Commissioners to appoint as CPCNH Member Rep/Alt
 - Nominate Authorized Officer to be appointed by County Administrator
 - Nominate individuals to serve on CPCNH Committees.
 - Recommend EAP amendments for consideration.
 - Approve withdrawal of municipalities from the program
 - Assume additional duties towards enabling voluntary, cost effective and innovative solutions to local energy needs










Electricity Choices
